Major Law Firm Announces Relocation Second Reincarnation for Historic Church



The building at 1561 Ouellette will undergo extensive renovations, including a large new addition in order to meet the needs of the law offices of Sutts, Strosberg LLP.

A beautiful former Anglican church (built around 1948) will soon receive its second reincarnation.

In 2004, the building received major renovations converting it into commercial offices for an architectural firm. **Sutts, Strosberg LLP** has engaged **Rosati** as design-builder for the current project including an addition of about 4,000 square feet.

The addition has been architecturally designed to provide a modernized but seamless blend. The addition's office area has been designed to match the church with exposed wood decking and structural steel. An elevator will provide accessibility for all three levels and an employee courtyard will be an added amenity.

The existing church will undergo strategic renovations to create new offices while maintaining its cathedral ceilings.

Customer Demand Propels CenterLine Expansion





CenterLine (Windsor) Ltd. on Morton Drive in LaSalle is expanding its main Special Machinery Division. Driven by an increased level of customer demand it will be benefit from **Rosati's** fast track design build program.

The exterior of the expansion will be designed to match the existing building and additional parking space will create greater efficiency for staff and customers.

A thriving tool shop in Oldcastle is adding a second plant with the assistance of Rosati's Partnership Program, which sees clients partner with Rosati to provide assistance with capital requirements.

Select Tool is adding a second plant on North Talbot next to its recently completed headquarters, also built by **Rosati** under the Partnership Program. The new 21,000-square-foot facility will include a two-story office area and will be **Select's** CNC machining centre.

"We had very positive customer feedback when we built our main facility and that led to increased opportunities and growth," says **Select Tool** VP Dave Tomassi. "We are already using a second facility and we are out of space there. We will be adding more machines and transferring over the existing ones," he added. Construction on the new plant began in June and is slated for completion early next year.




After a very competive tender process, Rosati has begun construction on the new Leamington District High School for the Greater Essex County School Board, slated to open for the 2017 school year.

Rosati has the benefit of previous school experience, having completed major projects such as constructing a new French Catholic High School for the Conseil Scolaire de District des écoles Catholiques du Sud-Ouest (now **Conseil Scolaire Catholique Providence**).

Rosati has also carried out expansions at elementary schools such as Essex Public School, Queen Elizabeth Public School and East Mersea Public School. The new Learnington Secondary School was designed for the **Greater Essex County District School Board** by **Glos Associates Inc.**, incorporating 121,437 square feet over two stories. The complex project includes about 31 classrooms and will have computer labs, culinary classes, theatre arts, a construction shop, transportation shop, weight and exercise room, sub-dividable triple gym with a music stage, a library resource room, administration areas, and a student commons and cafeteria/auditorium space.

Malden Dental Shines Bright in LaSalle - New Patients Welcome



The newly opened Malden Dental offices in LaSalle were designed and built by Rosati Group, taking advantage of the Rosati Partnership Program.

Owned by dentists Dr. Lara Souliere and Dr. Michael Jacobs, the building at 5955 Malden Rd. comes in at 5,096 square feet and includes a main level and lower level. The structure incorporates 12 operatories, lab and sterilization space, administration offices and a beautiful reception and waiting area.

"The plan was to inject a feeling of warmth to decrease any anxiety caused by visiting a dental office," said Dr. Jacobs. "The owners wanted to bring a more positive, small-town atmosphere of customized dentistry, while also meeting and exceeding the highest standards of cleanliness with state-of-the-art technology," he adds.

The building is conventionally-constructed using the post and beam method with a poured concrete foundation for the lower level. Unique exterior aesthetics include a blended combination façade brick, punched aluminum windows, EIFS and strategically located accents of stone and architectural wood siding.

"We picked Rosati because they are tremendously experienced. Besides the advantage of working with a local contractor, they build awesome buildings and bring a level of detail that is hard to find. We were trying to customize every detail and we found a contractor with the same beliefs. Rosati to Revitalize Award-Winning Development

Rosati is proud to announce the acquisition of Lakeshore Oasis at the corner of Patillo Road and the Expressway. The project was originally design-built by Rosati for a developer in 2008.

The development consists of 10.75 acres that includes two 28,500 Sq. Ft. commercial buildings with an excellent mix of Health and Wellness tenants such as Physiotherapists, Dentists, Hair Salon, Walk in Clinic, a Pharmacy and restaurants.
