

Building on its success in the LaSalle market, **The G.O.A.T. Tap & Eatery** is bringing its "Greatest of All Time" vibe to Lakeshore in another welcoming location constructed by **Rosati**.

The family-friendly sports venue has found its second home in the **Lakeshore MedArts** building with 5,279 square feet designed by **ADA Architects** to bring a similar look and feel as the original rustic-chic LaSalle location.

The G.O.A.T. has something for everyone, combining the casual atmosphere of a

sports bar with an impressive gastro-pub menu. Sixteen HD TVs surround the perimeter for an immersive sports experience, and the attractive contemporary décor is dotted with memorabilia from some of the "Greatest Athletes of All Time." A separate dining area welcomes families, and a spectacular outdoor patio with favorite backyard games rounds out the total package.

Co-owner Matt Komsa said the Lakeshore area was chosen as a perfect fit for the brand, with "tons of potential" in an under-serviced area.

Fresh new market coming to Chatham

Fresh prepared foods and convenience for busy families will be the focus for a new modern Chatham food market. Rosati was chosen to design-build the new concept.

A whole new shopping experience is coming to Chatham as **Mercato Fresh**, a 14,000-square-foot boutique-style food market, is set to open in a portion of the former Target store on Grand Ave. West. **Rosati** was chosen to design-build the new concept store, the first in a chain planned by Co-Owners Marc Romualdi, owner of Windsor's **M.R. Meat** Markets, and Jonathan Reaume, owner of **Toscana restaurant**.

Mercato Fresh will offer hot and cold prepared foods, fresh produce, meat and fish, a bakery, a café, and freshly prepared sushi.

The Goose is loose in Lakeshore

A new Loose Goose RestoPub & Lounge design-built by Rosati will bring "refined industrial aesthetics" to the Lakeshore area, striking a balance between vintage and industrial with a sports pub atmosphere.



The location in **Lakeshore Oasis Town Centre** will be an addition to the original **Loose Goose** in downtown Windsor. At 4,620 square feet, the new **Loose Goose** will feature numerous large format TV's, table and booth seating, and a "beer tower" with 40 beers on tap.

The restaurant is expected to open in early December, and by spring a large patio will offer plenty of outdoor seating.

J & J Marine expands services on Fighting Island

Rosati chosen for improvements to facilities for seasoned hunters adding over 3,100 sq ft of new amenities, including a new kitchen and dog kennel buildings.

Rosati has design-built various projects on Fighting Island for **J & J Marine**, the operator of a private hunt club and lodge offering personalized game hunts for corporate employees. The club provides amenities including highly-trained hunting dogs, camouflage hunting gear, shotguns, meals and lodging. The most recent projects design-built by **Rosati** include a 1,200-square-foot full-service dedicated kitchen building, and a new 1,900-square-foot dog kennel and storage facility. The kennel includes 12 interconnected exterior/interior kennel spaces for prized hunting dogs, as well as a dog-wash zone and high-security storage areas.

Lincoln Laser Solutions Expands for new Lathe





A complex machine foundation was a key component the Rosati engineering team had to design and install as part of this new 6,250 sq.ft. addition.

Oldcastle-based **Lincoln Laser Solutions** is undergoing a conventionally-constructed 6,250-square-foot addition to its facilities. This will allow the company to expand its manufacturing space as well as add a new compressor room, washrooms and a 25-ton crane extension.

Rosati was chosen to design-build the project including a complex machine foundation with a built-in trough system. The foundation is designed to hold a new lathe machine weighing more than 147,000 pounds when fully loaded, allowing them to turn-key repair extremely large components.
